Objective:

To accelerate the role of biomedical engineers in Materiovigilance Programme of India (MvPI) by engaging in accessing the adverse events associated with the use of medical devices.

Background:

Indian Pharmacopoeia commission (IPC), an autonomous institution of Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India, has been entrusted with National Coordination Centre responsibilities related to Materiovigilance Programme of India (MvPI) since 6th July 2015 with an objective to improving Indian patient safety by monitoring, recording, analyzing root cause of adverse events or risks associated with use of medical devices and suggesting regulatory bodies for appropriate action with a sole intention of improving patient safety. As the new Medical Device Rules 2017 being effective from January 2018, the MVPI programme of Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Govt. of India under the aegis of IPC is imperative for the successful Medical Device Adverse Event Reporting in the country.

MVPI aims to promote and facilitate adverse event reporting of Medical Devices and subsequently evaluating these events. The scientific and systematic evaluation of these medical device events / reports will foster monitoring trends for improving and protecting the health and safety of patients. As medical devices industries are one of the major stakeholders of MvPI, their participation needs to be encouraged to make significant impact in the outcome.
